


## Young people in Central Queensland Region

There are 929 people who experience homelessness in the Central Queensland Region on any given day according the to 2016 Census. Of these 126 were young people, accounting for roughly 14% of the total homeless population. Of those young people, 42% identified as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or both.



The majority of homeless were concentrated in Rockhampton and a smaller concentration in Gladstone.

Where young people experiencing homelessness are living by %



- Persons living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out
- Persons in supported accommodation for the homeless
- Persons staying temporarily with other households
- Persons living in boarding houses
- Persons in other temporary lodgings
- Persons living in 'severely' crowded dwellings

The data shows that most young people in the Central Queensland Region aged 12 - 24 years of age were in severely overcrowded dwellings.
