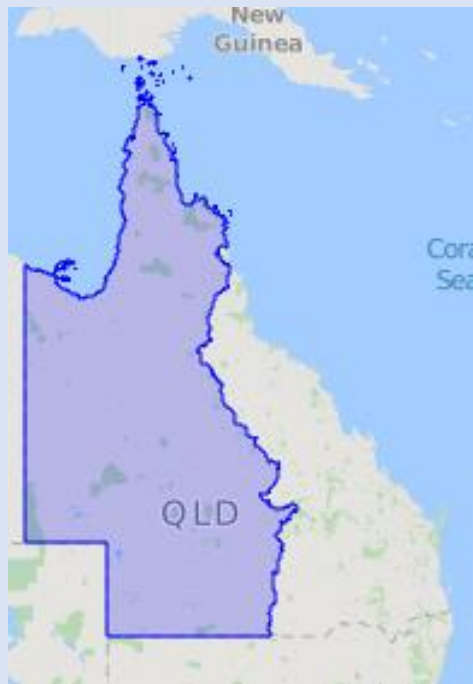

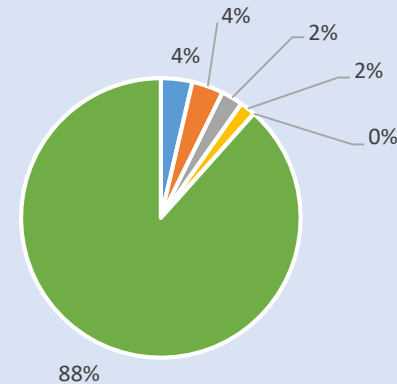
Young people in Queensland Outback Region

There are 1,892 people who experience homelessness in the Queensland Outback Region on any given day according to the 2016 Census. Of these 442 were young people, accounting for roughly 23% of the total homeless population.



The majority of homeless were concentrated in the north of the region and 89% of young people who were experiencing homelessness identified as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or both.

Where young people experiencing homelessness are living by %



- Persons living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out
- Persons in supported accommodation for the homeless
- Persons staying temporarily with other households
- Persons living in boarding houses
- Persons in other temporary lodgings
- Persons living in 'severely' crowded dwellings

The data shows that most young people in the Queensland Outback aged 12 – 24 years of age were in severely overcrowded dwellings (88%).
