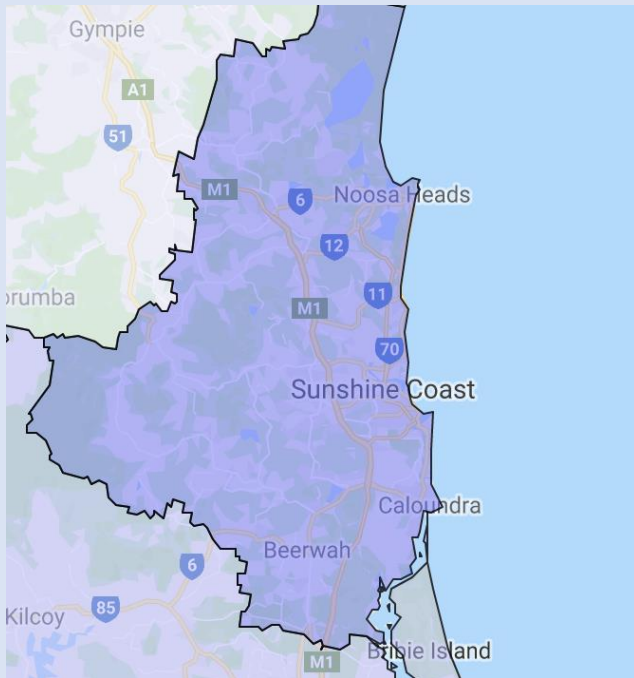

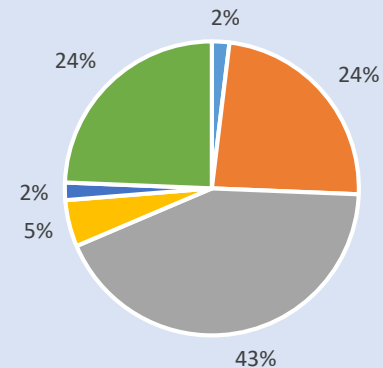
Young people in Sunshine Coast Region

There are 894 people who experience homelessness in the Sunshine Coast on any given day according to the 2016 Census. Of these 153 were young people, accounting for roughly 17% of the total homeless population.



The majority people experiencing homelessness were concentrated in Nambour, Sunshine Coast Hinterland and the centres of Maroochy and Caloundra

Where young people experiencing homelessness are living by %



- Persons living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out
- Persons in supported accommodation for the homeless
- Persons staying temporarily with other households
- Persons living in boarding houses
- Persons in other temporary lodgings
- Persons living in 'severely' crowded dwellings

The data shows that most young people in the Sunshine Coast aged 12 – 24 years of age were couch surfing.
