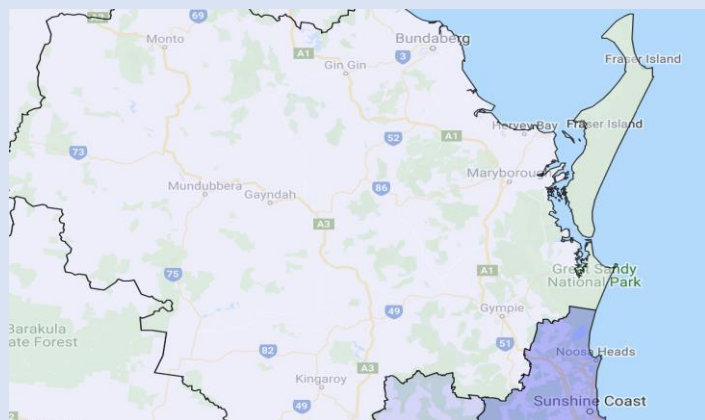


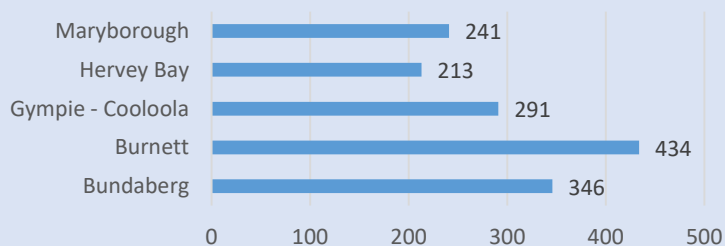

Young people in Wide Bay

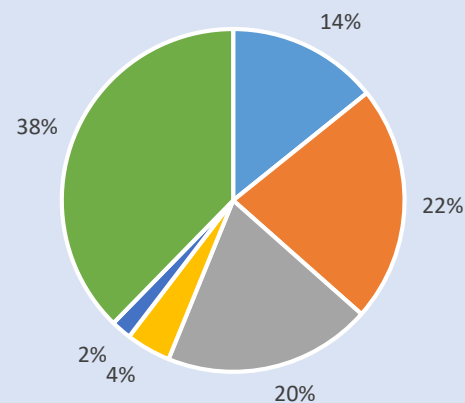
There are 1,522 people who experience homelessness in the Wide Bay on any given day according to the 2016 Census. Of these 255 were young people, accounting for roughly 17% of the total homeless population in the region.

Where young people experiencing homelessness are living by %



- Persons living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out
- Persons in supported accommodation for the homeless
- Persons staying temporarily with other households
- Persons living in boarding houses
- Persons in other temporary lodgings
- Persons living in 'severely' crowded dwellings

The data shows that most young people who are homeless in the Wide Bay regions, aged 12 – 24 years of age, were spread diversely across living arrangements with a lack of boarding houses available and a high proportion of young people rough sleeping (14%).
