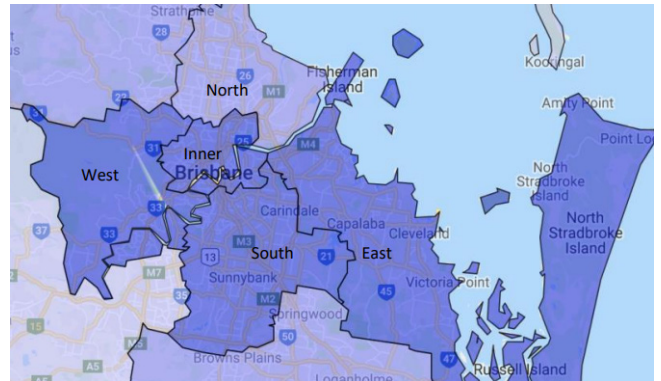




FACTS & FIGURES

Young people in Brisbane

- On Census night in 2021 there were 4340 people homeless in Brisbane.
- From this total 822 (18.9%) were young people aged 12-24.
- Brisbane young people constituted 17.03% of Queensland's homeless young people.
- 83 young people identified as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, or both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (accounting for 10.1% of homeless young people).
- A further 644 young people were counted within the Census as living in 'other marginal' accommodation (i.e. living in 'other crowded', 'other improvised dwellings', and 'housed in caravan parks' – the majority of which were living in 'other crowded dwellings' (97.4%).
- In contrast to the 2016 Census Brisbane saw a reduction in youth homelessness by 29.3% (down from 1163).



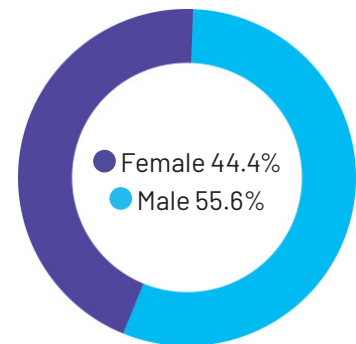
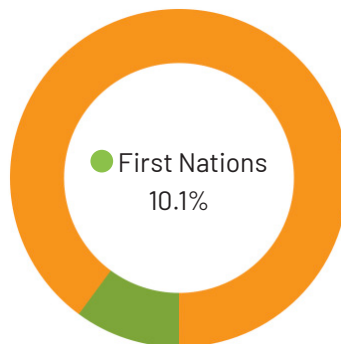
YOUNG PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS



Breakdown of distribution for the 822 young people experiencing homelessness in 2021 included:

- Living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out (2.2%)
- Living in supported accommodation for the homeless (25.2%)
- Staying temporarily with other households (14.1%)
- Living in boarding houses (24.5%)
- Living in other temporary lodgings (2.4%)
- Living in 'severely' crowded dwellings (31.6%)

- The majority of young people experiencing homelessness in Brisbane are in the South (33.9%) and in the Inner City (29.7%)
- For 'Young people living in supported accommodation for the homeless' – 66.8% were Female
- For 'Young people living in boarding houses' – 68.3% were Male
