

FACTS & FIGURES

Young people in Logan - Beaudesert Region

- On Census night in 2021 there were 1718 people homeless in Logan Beaudesert.
- From this total 529 (30.8%) were young people aged 12-24.
- Logan Beaudesert young people constituted 10.96% of Queensland's homeless young people.
- 48 young people identified as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, or both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (accounting for 9.1% of homeless young people).
- A further 677 young people were counted within the Census as living in 'other marginal' accommodation (i.e. living in 'other crowded', 'other improvised dwellings', and 'housed in caravan parks' – the majority of which were living in 'other crowded dwellings' (98.1%))
- In contrast to the 2016 Census Logan Beaudesert saw an increase in youth homelessness by 49% (up from 355).



YOUNG PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS



Breakdown of distribution for the 529 young people experiencing homelessness in 2021 included:

- Living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out (1.2%)
- Living in supported accommodation for the homeless (17.7%)
- Staying temporarily with other households (9.4%)
- Living in boarding houses (1.4%)
- Living in other temporary lodgings (0%)
- Living in 'severely' crowded dwellings (70.3%)
- For 'Young people living in supported accommodation for the homeless' – 60% were Female
- For 'Young people living in 'severely' crowded dwellings' – 58.1% were Female
