
FACTS & FIGURES

Young people in Moreton (North and South) Region

- On Census night in 2021 there were 1433 people homeless in Moreton.
- From this total 316 (22.1%) were young people aged 12-24.
- Moreton young people constituted 6.55% of Queensland's homeless young people.
- 41 young people identified as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, or both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (accounting for 13% of homeless young people).
- A further 373 young people were counted within the Census as living in 'other marginal' accommodation (i.e. living in 'other crowded', 'other improvised dwellings', and 'housed in caravan parks' – the majority of which were living in 'other crowded dwellings' (93.8%).
- In contrast to the 2016 Census Moreton saw an increase in youth homelessness by 6.8% (up from 296).

Breakdown of distribution for the 316 young people experiencing homelessness in 2021 included:

- Living in improvised dwellings, tents, or sleeping out (0%)
- Living in supported accommodation for the homeless (16.7%)
- Staying temporarily with other households (23.5%)
- Living in boarding houses (1.3%)
- Living in other temporary lodgings (0%)
- Living in 'severely' crowded dwellings (58.5%)
- 65.8% of young people experiencing homelessness in the region are in Moreton North.
- For 'Young people living in supported accommodation for the homeless' – 66.7% were Female
- For 'Young people living in 'severely' crowded dwellings' – 52.6% were Male
